

What is reconciliation?

At its heart, reconciliation is about strengthening relationships between Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples and non-Indigenous peoples, for the benefit of all Australians.

For Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, Australia's colonial history is characterised by devastating land dispossession, violence, and racism. Over the last half-century, however, many significant steps towards reconciliation have been taken.

Reconciliation is an ongoing journey that reminds us that while generations of Australians have fought hard for meaningful change, future gains are likely to take just as much, if not more, effort.

In a just, equitable and reconciled Australia, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children will have the same life chances and choices as non-Indigenous children, and the length and quality of a person's life will not be determined by their racial background.

What is a Reconciliation Action Plan?

A Reconciliation Action Plan (RAP) gives your organisation a framework to contribute to the reconciliation movement. RAPs deliver tangible and substantive benefits for First Nations peoples and increase cultural safety in the workplace.

What does reconciliation look like?

The Berri Barmera Council Reconciliation Action Plan Working Group is seeking input from the broader community on what reconciliation should look like for Berri Barmera Council. Input received may be used to form the vison and included in the Councils Reconciliation Action Plan

Input can be in the form of dot points, paragraphs or single words.

- Working with Traditional Custodians to create appropriate spaces that acknowledges and celebrates Aboriginal and Torres Strait Island cultures, history and contributions to the community
- Working with Traditional Custodians to ensure the protection, care of Country and culturally significant sites within the Mid Murray area
- · Walking the journey of reconciliation with the broader community
