Section 21 and 23 Approval,

- As at 20 September 2021, the requisite documentation has been drafted and will be provided to the Crown Solicitor's Office (CSO) for certification in the coming weeks. CSO's certification process takes about 3-4 weeks and, the Premier generally provides his response within 2-3 weeks of receipt of the CSO's certification.
- Based on this information AAR provided notification that approval processes could take between 5-10 weeks from 20 September.





The intended outcomes of the program are:


